ELIGIBILITY: FAA membership is not required. All works must be original, dry and suitable for general viewing and must not have been shown in a previous FAA show. Frames and gallery edges must be presentable. Limit of 3 entries per artist. **Entrants must agree to sit the gallery for 3 hours or pay a \$20 fee for a substitute at the time of registration.**

Thordarson Special Award:	\$100 plus a one year FAI Membership

* **Cash prize awards may be limited as follows:** 10 or fewer entries in a category – 1st place only; 11-20 entries – 1st & 2nd place only. Honorable mentions are at the judge's discretion with a maximum of four per category.

ENTRY FEE (non-refundable): FAA Members: First piece: \$20, second/third pieces: \$10 ea
Non-Members: First piece: \$30, second/third pieces: \$15 ea
Full-time Student (FAA Member) with ID: First piece: \$ 5, second/ third piece: \$ 5 ea
Full-time Student (Non-Member) with ID: First piece: \$10, second /third piece: \$ 5 ea

SPECIFICATIONS:

Artist's name, phone number, title of work and asking price must be legibly printed on back of each entry.

NO saw-tooth hangers. All work must have screw eyes and wire (ends taped) strong enough for weight of piece.

Maximum framed width, including diptychs and triptychs, is 50". No height limit.

3-dimensional piece maximum weight is 50 lbs.

Paintings, photos, graphics, computer works and mixed media **may be covered with glass if the size is 30"x30" or less** (excluding frame). **Plexiglas is required on larger pieces** – except on pastels and charcoal works.

No work may be removed from the gallery until the close of the show

SHOW JUDGE

Classically trained artist Igor Koutsenko was born and raised on the Crimean Peninsula. He emigrated to the US in 1992 and taught fine art at the University of Central Oklahoma. His work has been shown and collected internationally. His work evidences expertise in a diversity of mediums that include acrylic painting, woodcutting, intaglio and drawing in a variety of genres. CATHERINE HALLER DEMOS APRIL 14

This demo and General Meeting will be held at the Library, 5:30-8:00, but future meetings, starting in May, will be held at the Fallbrook Art School on Alvarado. (Story below).

Catherine Haller, oils, remembers drawing, Crayola in hand, as a child. Her high school art teacher inspired her to enter exhibits and she won two National Scholastic Art Awards by age sixteen. She attended Otis Art Institute in Los Angeles, Honolulu Art Academy and the Academy of Art University in San Francisco. She has received many awards and is represented in galleries in Southern California and Connecticut, her home state.

She describes herself as a contemporary realist who paints abstractly. She begins by using abstract areas of color, shapes and contrast but the result is realistic. She likes to tell a story and create a mood. Recently she is painting in the style of the old masters wanting to combine the old masters technique with contemporary objects.



New General Meeting Location and Date Starting in May

Starting May 8, general meetings will be held on the second Thursday of the month, 5:30 to 8:30, at the Fallbrook Art School, 310 East Alvarado in Fallbrook. FAA board authorized payment of a small fee for use of the art school room. "Meeting at the school could prove highly beneficial for both groups. Being on the premises will expose FAA artists to events at the school and, by being there, we support the school. It seems like a good fit," said Carol Reardon.



Cathy Carey's March Demo and Workshop

Every demo artist has something of value to teach no matter what the media. Cathy Carey's media of choice for the demo was acrylic. Her lesson for the evening was the value of under-painting with gold. Watercolorists use cad yellow, she said. Also, her drawing was made of bold, black lines, sometimes as much as a quarter inch wide. As she did the overpainting, she selectively left parts of her drawing uncovered and allowed the gold to shine through here and there. The effect was pleasing, energetic and painterly. BJ Wilson often said to her students, "Let the viewers know an artist has been here, meaning, leave some signs of the brush strokes, in watercolor, a blossom or two, something that happened because of the brush passing by other than to carefully put color in the right place. Cathy's work had that quality, many little surprises here and there.

The number of art assist sessions at the library has been reduced to once a month because volunteers are limited. I strongly encourage all you artists to consider giving some of your time to offer these children the opportunity to create a piece of art. If you are worried about what projects to do, we have many lesson plans available for your use. We have lots of supplies and will reimburse you for any you need to obtain. The lessons do not need to be complicated. These kids make interesting art projects with just a simple idea.
