Michael Steirnagle has been a professional artist for 45 years. He received his professional training at Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles and his at El Paso.

He started his career as an illustrator doing album covers for such notables as Jerry Garcia, Lynard Skynard and many others. He has done dozens of book jackets, magazine covers and advertising art for companies throughout the U.S. In 1990, Michael moved into Fine Art working in oils utilizing mostly the human figure, He taught College art at Palomar College in San Marcos for 25 years and retired in 2015 to focus on Gallery Painting as well as conducting many workshops at the prestigious Scottsdale Artists' School and in his studio in Escondido and through art organizations throughout the Southwest.

Currently he is represented by Coda Gallery in-Palm Desert as well as several galleries on the East Coast. He maintains his studio in Escandido and has a home in Indian Wells as well as Nosara, Costa Rica.

Since our move to a new location and time and our increased outreach, we have had quite a few new artists join our association. As time goes on we hope to profile these new members so you can get to know them better.

For this issue, we will begin with Carolyn and Harold Buchman who joined us a couple of months ago.

Carolyn and Harold are both Los Angeles born and were married there as well. They met Contra dancing in Pasadena. They transplanted themselves from their home in Torrance to Fallbrook in August of last year. Proving the value of FAA "showing up" at Fallbrook

events, Harold and Carolyn encountered a couple of brave FAA members showing their art in the dark at the tree-lighting ceremony in the park. Carolyn says, "We walked past the booth and then headed back to take a better look and to talk to the artist. We were so glad that we did."

They both have been "arty" people for a long time. Carolyn has a degree in Merchandizing (interior design) from FIDM and a BFA in Illustration, and a certificate in Biomedical Illustration from California State University Long Beach. She has worked for LA unified as an art specialist and taught classes at a senior centers. She also has staged homes for resale, designed product lines, posters, and created characters.

Harold paints draws and designs use the computer. He loves to sketch large machines, people and animals. Sometimes he sketches from life and sometimes just from ideas he has in his head. He has a degree in Design from UCLA.

Harold has worked in the movie industry for years doing animation lighting and compositing and color correcting. In other words, he performs highly technical computer programing under extreme pressures. He now works for a computer-engineering firm as a programmer in LA.

Carolyn's interest is in creating a visually appealing work no matter the media or task. She says "Sometimes that means pushing the limits and other times it means letting a happy accident happen then there are the times when it is all about control to the max. It is about the visual balance finding its way through me."

She uses everything from embroidery to sculpture, computer, paper, paint, glass, wood, everything she can get her hands on with the exception of harmfull chemicals, which for her includes oil paints. Her asthma dictates what she need to stay clear of.

They work mostly in their studios as opposed to plein air, using their outings as information gathering forays looking for good compositions and moments worthy of capturing with their cameras. This information then informs their in-studio art sessions with what ever medium is chosen to accomplish their visions.

Between them their other loves include gardening, cooking, especially exotic dishes, rebuilding antique furniture, upholstery, reading, hiking, attending ethnic festivals, music (especially Irish, Scottish and Eastern European), singing Sea Shanties, tall sailing ships, riding bikes, playing clarinet and listening to stories.
